Investment Objective and Policy Summary

The aim of the Fund is to increase the value of your investment through investment in a diversified and actively managed portfolio of shares and share-related securities. The Fund is actively managed and will invest at least two-thirds in securities domiciled, listed, quoted or traded on regulated markets globally.

Subject to the above, the Fund is not subject to any limitation on the proportion of its net asset value that may be invested in any one country or sector. Investment in other funds is limited to 10% of the Fund's assets. The Fund is actively managed.

The Fund is measured against the MSCI ACWI NR benchmark. The Investment Manager has the freedom to invest in securities that are not part of the benchmark.

COMMENTARY

Weaker US jobs data sparked recession fears and a global equity market sell off. US Fed chair Jay Powell signalled “the time has come” to start cutting rates.

The global equity market sell off proved short lived. In the US, the S&P 500 Index rose 2.3%, but the tech-heavy Nasdaq gained just 0.6%. European indices closed near record highs (DAX +2.2%; IBEX +3.0%), but Japan lagged (TOPIX -2.9%). China fell on disappointing economic data (CSI 300 -3.5%).

Global bonds rallied further. The 10 year US Treasury returned 1.4%, while the 10 year German Bund gained 0.5%. Corporate bonds rallied and credit spreads snapped back in, on hopes of a soft US landing.

The portfolio returned -0.2% over the month compared with the MSCI All Country World Index's (ACWI) return of -0.8% (returns in Japanese yen terms). Relative contributors are Meta Platforms, AstraZeneca and Amazon on a stock level. Relative detractors are Tesla, ASML and SLB on a stock level.

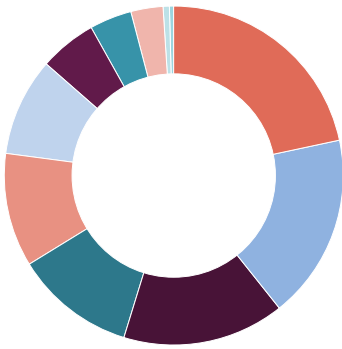
